

**Report of the Glenn D. Loucks Track and Field Games
May 6, 7 & 8, 2010
Held at White Plains High School**

The Glenn D. Loucks Track and Field Games were held at White Plains High School on May 6, 7, 8, 2010. This was the 43rd anniversary of the games and they were a huge success thanks largely to the assistance provided by the Rotary Club of White Plains and its members. More than 260 teams totaling over 2600 athletes were present at this year's event making it the largest on-site high school invitational track meet in the country.
