

**Report of the Glenn D. Loucks Track and Field Games
May 12, 13, & 14, 2011
Held at White Plains High School**

The Glenn D. Loucks Track and Field Games were held at White Plains High School on May 12, 13, 14, 2011. This was the 44th anniversary of the games and they were a huge success thanks largely to the assistance provided by the Rotary Club of White Plains and its members. More than 230 teams totaling over 2500 athletes were present at this year's event making it the largest on-site high school invitational track meet in the country.
